The regular monthly meeting of the Village of Bible Hill was held on August 16, 2005 at 7:00 pm; in the Village Hall, 69 Pictou Road.

The Chair called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Present: Chair Hilliard, Deputy Chair Burke, Commissioner Blair, Commissioner McKenna and Commissioner McLean.

Staff: Mr. Christianson, Clerk and Treasurer; Ms. Miller, Solicitor and Mrs. Ogden, Recording Secretary.

In attendance: Councillor Mingo, Mr. Black, Mr. Chisholm, and Mr. Malloy, Daily News.

- Review and Approval of minutes of June 21, July 12 and August 9.

On motion of McLean and seconded by Burke that the minutes of June 21, July 12 and August 9th be approved as presented.

Motion carried.

Review and approval of agenda, call for new or other business

On motion of Burke and seconded by McKenna that the agenda be approved with the additions of: infilling Farnham Road, presentation from Sgt Darrah during in camera session regarding beer tents.

Motion carried.

Miscellaneous business including delegations

The commission had no delegations. Chair Hilliard welcomed Councillor Mingo, Mr. Chisholm and Mr. Black to the meeting.

Business arising out of minutes

- Sale of Walkways – Somerset Drive

The Clerk and Treasurer reviewed the two property appraisals for the Somerset Drive properties conducted by Weatherbee Appraisals.

On motion of McKenna and seconded by Burke that the Village of Bible Hill sell both walkways on Somerset Drive to adjacent property owners for a cost of \$700 plus all legal, survey and migration fees.

Motion carried.

It was agreed that the Village would enter an agreement with Mr. Lake to allow him to start construction before the property sale was completed.

- Draft Engineering Proposal Call

The Clerk reported that a letter has been sent to Minister Barnet, Service Nova Scotia concerning cost sharing on the pre-engineering design study.

The Village commission agreed to send the draft letter to Mayor Smith at the County of Colchester outlining our six year capital budget. It was agreed to send a copy of the capital budget to MP Bill Casey as well.

- Review of Committee appointments

Commissioner McKenna asked if any commissioner was interested in being the Commissioner responsible for the Safety Advisory Committee. The commission agreed that Commissioner McKenna should remain the responsible commissioner.

- Membership in Federation of Canadian Municipalities

On motion of Blair and seconded by McLean that the membership in Federation of Canadian Municipalities be tabled until further information is obtained.

Motion carried.

Review of Correspondence

- Application for Bible Hill Safety Advisory Committee

On motion of McKenna and seconded by Blair that the Village of Bible Hill accept the committee membership application for Ms. Laforest to join the Bible Hill Safety Advisory Committee.

Motion carried.

- Representation and laying of a wreath at the Anniversary of the Battle of Britain, Sunday September 18, 2005

Chair Hilliard will attend on behalf of the Village of Bible Hill.

Reports of Commissioners, and Clerk and Treasurer

- Commissioner McKenna

Commissioner McKenna reported that the brigade responded to 25 emergency calls during the period of June 9th to August 10th and that fall training will begin September 20, 2005.

Commissioner McKenna also reported that the issue of smoking in the Fire Brigade meeting room has been resolved to the satisfaction of the brigade members. It was agreed to remove this item from the agenda.

- Commissioner McLean

Commissioner McLean outlined various safety concerns within the Village. She said that the crosswalks in Bible Hill have not been painted and that school will start in a few weeks putting the children at risk. She also reported on the street condition of Avon Street. A letter will be sent to Nova Scotia Transportation and Public Works outlining the Villages concern of the recent paving job.

A discussion was held concerning catch basins in the Village. The commission agreed to put catch basins on their next committee meeting agenda.

- Commissioner Blair

Commissioner Blair reported that the tender will be sent out for engineering proposals. A discussion will take place on the water system under new business.

Commissioner McKenna inquired about the second river connection (through the NSAC lands) from the Town of Truro Water Utility to the Bible Hill section of the water system. Commissioner McKenna understood that the connection was not being used, and that this lack of use could be detrimental to water pressure and fire fighting abilities on the Bible Hill side. The Clerk was instructed to contact the Town of Truro Water Utility.

- Deputy Chairman Burke

Commissioner Burke reported that Canada Day was successful despite the wet weather. He also reported that the Village hosted a summer program for 60 Bible Hill Children at no cost. The director is working on a day camp program for next year. The commission would like to see a report on the recent summer program for Bible Hill Children.

A letter has been sent to the Mayor of Colchester County outlining the problem of infilling on Farnham Road.

- Clerk and Treasurer

The Clerk reviewed the financial statements for July. The Clerk reported that the Village full-time staff members have completed a cross cultural workshop hosted by CODA.

- Chair Hilliard

Chair Hilliard outlined various events he attended on behalf of the Village of Bible Hill during the months of July and August.
