Approval of agenda                      On motion of McKenna and seconded by Hilliard that the agenda be approved with the addition of placement of plaque identifying veteran's of the W.W. II in the Village Hall, Rodents identified in a Village subdivision, update overhead crosswalk signs, business operating in residential zones, and special funding for emergency generators.

Proposal call for Pre-                      The Clerk reviewed the proposal call. Twelve packages have Engineering Design Services                      been emailed out. The ads were placed on the Government of Nova Scotia Website and in the Daily News. Closing date is November 25<sup>th</sup>. A three person evaluation committee will point score the proposals. Currently engineers from Truro and Service Nova Scotia have agreed to help, Colchester has declined. After the proposals are evaluated, the pricing envelope will be opened; this information will be consolidated for the commission, at the committee meeting of December

50 Km Speed Zone for College      It was agreed that correspondence would be sent to NSTPW

Road	requesting that a standard 50km speed zone be in place for College Road.
Crosswalk Armstrong at Clover	The request for a crosswalk on Armstrong at Clover was discussed. A school crossing guard would be required at this location (due to the proximity of the school); given the low traffic numbers it was not felt that the expense of a crossing guard would be warranted.
Roof damage claim	It was agreed that (a) the village is not prepared to make repairs to the complainant's roof (b) if the complainant makes an insurance claim for damages then the village will address that issue at that time (b) the Parks and Recreation Director be instructed to investigate the necessity and cost of installing a netting system at the Senior Ball Field.
Budget Discussions	A detailed review of a draft 2006 2007 budget was made.
Plaque commemorating service in the Canadian Armed Forces in W.W. II	On motion of Blair and seconded by Hilliard that the Commission in Committee recommend that the Village Commission place in the Bible Hill Village Hall a plaque commemorating service in the Canadian Armed Forces in W.W. II donated by Ben Cavanaugh.  Motion carried
Rodents identified in a Village subdivision	Commissioner Blair reported that rats were identified at a third Bible Hill neighbourhood last summer; the Clerk was requested to get an update from the Dept. of Environment on the status of their investigations last summer.
Overhead crosswalk signs	The Clerk reported that all materials for the sign at the intersection of Hazel and Pictou should be in Bible Hill by the 15 <sup>th</sup> . The installation of this set of signs should be completed by the end of November. Installation of the second set will take place in the spring when the sidewalk work required at the Jennifer Drive and Pictou Road location can take place.
Business in Residential Zones	It was agreed that a letter be drafted to the Development Officer making inquires into what appears to be two business operating in residential zones.
Funding from the Province of Nova Scotia for emergency generators	It was agreed to make inquiries into potential funding (up to \$3,600) for the installation of emergency generators in fire hall and community halls.
